



#### FROM ALLISON BRENNAN

Aspiring writers always ask me what I wish I'd known at the beginning of my career that I know now. There are two things:

- 1. It doesn't get easier. While some books are "easier" to write than others, you will always be trying to write better, craft stronger stories, make each book superior to the last. The plus side? With time and experience, you'll find ways to overcome the struggle.
- 2. Write what you love. If you write to market, you'll always be chasing your market. Write what you love, then edit it to fit a market. You'll never please all the readers all the time, but if you please yourself then edit ruthlessly, you'll find *your* readers.






Book three in **Sheila Lowe's** Beyond the Veil paranormal suspense series, THE LAST DOOR, will be published on October 1.




